Former RI President Ian Risely OAM was the speaker and his topic was "Why good people should want to be Rotarians".

Ian gave four reasons:

- 1. To meet other good people and make friends.
- 2. Personal Development whether it be project management, public speaking, how to run a meeting, or any of the many other opportunities to develop new skills.
- 3. Professional or Business Development. Rotary provides great opportunities to network with other professionals and business people.
- 4. The opportunity to make a difference. Ian argued this was the most important element, and of course it was the theme for his year as RI President.

It is no surprise there is a close alignment between lan's reasons for good people to join and the Objects of Rotary.

Ian went on to speak about the current status of membership in Australia which is sadly declining after nearly 100 years of activity, and contrasted this with "newer" Rotary countries like India, Taiwan and Korea where membership is growing strongly. In these countries membership of Rotary is keenly sought by potential members and seen as a real privilege.
